LEAD SERVICE LINE REPLACEMENT PROGRAM

WHAT IS A SERVICE LINE?

The pipe that connects your indoor plumbing to the water main in the street is called a service line. In the City of Sheboygan, service lines are owned and must be maintained by the property owner.

WHY DOES MY LEAD SERVICE LINE NEED TO BE REPLACED?

Local ordinance requires the full replacement of all lead and galvanized service lines due to potential health risks associated with these service line materials. Lead and galvanized service lines cannot be repaired and must be replaced. Disrupted lead and galvanized service lines cannot be put back into service.

GRANT AND NO INTEREST LOAN PROGRAM

Available grants range from 0% to 100% based on census tract data determined by the WDNR. The customer may opt to pay the remaining balance in full or choose to apply for the Utility's loan program. The loan program offers a 36- or 72-month, 0% interest loan.

PREOUALIFIED CONTRACTORS

Contractors are required to prequalify to participate in the City of Sheboygan's Lead Service Line Replacement Program ahead of performing any work under the program. A current copy of the W-9 form, and proof of insurance are required. The EPA and DNR require that all lead service line replacements using federal funds must follow all federal regulations. Additionally, all work performed must be conducted in compliance with all federal, state, and local laws, orders, regulations, and ordinances.

Property owners are required to obtain at least **two bids** for replacement from the Prequalified Contractor's list. The lowest bid contractor will be selected.

LEAD SERVICE LINE REPLACEMENT PROGRAM

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

Your contractor will contact you directly to schedule your lead service line replacement. Most replacements are completed in less than one day. During the project, the contractor will need access to your basement 3–5 times. Whenever possible, trenchless methods will be used to minimize disruptions to your yard and landscaping.
